A Brief History of the University of Waikato Te Whare Wānanga o Waikato

The University had its genesis in 1956, when a small group of visionary individuals began working towards the founding of a university for the people of the South Auckland region. A college, a sub-branch of Auckland University, was established in 1959 and in 1965, after opening its doors in 1964, the University of Waikato was officially opened by the then Governor-General, Sir Bernard Fergusson (later Lord Ballantrae).

From these modest beginnings, on what was largely farmland and with only a handful of temporary buildings and staff, the University of Waikato now provides around 205 qualifications to a student population of approximately 13,000, of whom more than 4,800 complete a qualification annually. Today, the University employs approximately 1,560 full-time equivalent staff and makes a significant contribution to the local economy.

The University of Waikato celebrated its 40th anniversary in 2004. This important milestone was accompanied by significant change - we mourned the death of our Foundation Vice-Chancellor, Professor Don Llewellyn, and farewelled our third Vice-Chancellor, Professor Bryan Gould, who retired after ten years in the post. With great optimism and a focus on the future, we commenced the next chapter of our history by welcoming our fourth Vice-Chancellor, Professor Roy Crawford, at the beginning of 2005.

Our focus on the future was quickly cemented, as we embarked on the development and delivery of an ambitious Vision for the period 2005 – 2015. The key themes of our new Vision are Excellence, Distinctiveness and International Connectedness. We are committed to delivering a world-class education and research portfolio, providing a full and dynamic university experience which is distinctive in character, and pursuing strong international linkages to advance knowledge. The Vision articulates a strong framework which will define our fifth decade, presenting us with many exciting challenges and opportunities.

We play an essential leadership role in the prosperity of our region, which we define in terms of the tribal boundaries of the 16 iwi affiliated to Te Rōpu Manukura. It extends from Manukau down to Wanganui, across to Kahungunu, along the East Coast up to Hikurangi, continuing up to the Bay of Plenty, to the Coromandel and back to Manukau. We sit at the heart of a community of strong regional partnerships and take pride in the extent to which we reflect and serve the strengths and interests of our region.

Our quality Hamilton campus environment, with grounds covering an area of 65 hectares, continues to be a source of community pride. The grounds include sports fields, walkways, three lakes and extensive gardens. Great care is taken to maintain the beautiful grounds, while also developing the built environment to accommodate the University's growing needs.

As part of its new Vision, the University will promote the concept of a full university experience, which is more than just the accumulation of knowledge. Through a range of campus development and related strategies, it will enhance the entire intellectual, cultural, political, social and recreational life that students enjoy while enrolled.

The Hamilton campus is home to the WEL Energy Trust Academy of Performing Arts, a high-technology facility for the performance of drama, music, dance and Māori and other cultural performing arts. It is, at the same time, a vital teaching facility for the University, and a world-class performance venue, which has been welcomed by the Hamilton and wider Waikato communities who share it. Such is its great success that additions and extensions are being planned.

We are committed to increasing both the tertiary participation rate of our regional population overall, as well as the proportions of new school-leavers and postgraduate students. We are also committed to ensuring the ongoing relevance of the programmes we offer, and the effectiveness of our delivery of them. The University continues to deliver programmes in various locations throughout our region and more than 20 of our qualifications are available entirely or mostly through online study.

The University of Waikato has a campus at Tauranga and a strong relationship with the Bay of Plenty Polytechnic. The collaborative arrangements enjoyed by both institutions include the sharing of resources and services and joint provision of professional development and training opportunities for staff. Credit transfer arrangements between the two institutions are well-established.

The University has recently reaffirmed its commitment to the community in the Bay of Plenty and to sustaining that commitment in a manner that is focused and directly aligned with its new Vision and its role as one of the key drivers of economic growth in the region. With this in mind, the University will align itself with the region's economic and growth strategies as a means of ensuring that its own strategies are co-ordinated and integrated with those of the Bay of Plenty community.

The University has a network of staircasing arrangements with other tertiary providers in the region, providing clear academic pathways through agreed articulation, credit and contractual teaching arrangements. As a result, students in the region can take advantage of tertiary opportunities that would not otherwise have been so accessible.

We adhere to the concept of a university education that is, by definition, research-led. Through sustained research intensity and the attraction of high levels of external funding from public sector and industry sources, we aim to maintain a highly competitive research profile. Our staff participate in a wide range of research consortia, clusters and multi-institutional research teams locally, regionally, nationally and internationally. Located close to a recently established Innovation Park, we are exceptionally well-placed to contribute to the local and national economies by enhancing business capability in the region and increasing opportunities for the commercialisation of intellectual property.

We continue to foster a culture of internationalisation, measured through the diversity of our student and staff profiles, the support and celebration of that diversity, a long-standing pride in our reputation for the pastoral care of our international students, and the measures we take through curriculum, programme design and our global networks and connections to international influences.

From its inception the University has always been at the forefront of initiatives in support of Māori aspirations. Sir Bernard Fergusson made a deep and lasting impression with his message at the official opening of the University, saying that Waikato was "the first of the New Zealand universities to be planted right in the heart of traditionally Māori country". Since our foundation, we have worked closely with local iwi, particularly Tainui, to make the University accessible to Māori students and to foster an environment of success. Today we are proud to have the highest proportion of Māori students of any New Zealand university.

As part of our role in relation to life-long learning, the University's Centre for Continuing Education delivers each year, both in Hamilton and Tauranga, an adult and community education programme that draws heavily on university scholarship and expertise. We have always regarded our community education programmes as a very important and valuable dimension of our academic provision, a significant dimension of our Charter commitments to our region, to equity of access and to kaupapa and tikanga Māori.

We are proud of our evolution into a truly New Zealand institution which, as our motto reflects, supports our country's nation-building policies and reflects our nation's identity.

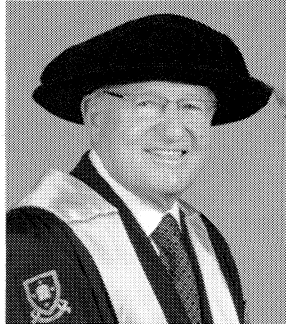

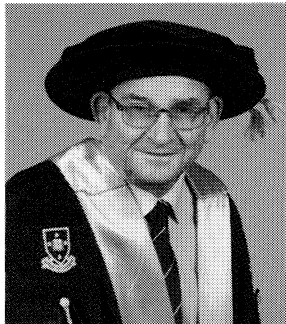
Rt Hon Jim Bolger Hon Doc *Khon Kaen Thailand* Hon Doc *Massey*



The Rt Hon Jim Bolger was Prime Minister of New Zealand from October 1990 to December 1997. During his 25-year career in politics he led the National Party for almost 12 years, was a Minister for 16 years and had three consecutive terms as the country's head of government. Under his leadership, the New Zealand economy was transformed from having the lowest growth rate among the 29 OECD nations to one of the strongest. On 31 December 1997 Mr Bolger was appointed a member of the Order of New Zealand (ONZ), New Zealand's highest honour. From June 1998 to January 2002 Mr Bolger was New Zealand's Ambassador to the United States. Today Mr Bolger is the chair of New Zealand Post and its subsidiary Kiwibank. He also chairs the Advisory Board of the World Agricultural Forum, St Louis, USA, is chairman of the Board of Directors of the Ian Axford Fellowships in Public Policy, Chairman of the Gas Industry Company Limited, Chairman of Express Couriers Limited, Chairman of Trustees Executors Limited, Trustee of the Rutherford Trust, President of the NZ/US Council. In January 2004 he was made Patron of the Institute of Rural Health. In February 2007 he was co-opted to the University of Waikato Council and elected Chancellor.

Pro Chancellor

Dr Brian Linehan ED MB ChB *Otago* Dip *Obst Auckland* FRCPA



Dr Linehan was born in Te Awamutu and raised on a dairy farm. He received his secondary school education in Auckland and completed his undergraduate degrees in Dunedin before undertaking postgraduate studies in Auckland, Sydney and Birmingham.

In 1971 he returned to the Waikato and entered into a partnership at Medlab Hamilton as well as taking up a Consultancy position at Waikato Hospital as Chemical Pathologist. Subsequently he became Managing Director of Medlab Hamilton but retired from Pathology in 2004.

Brian was an elected member of the Waikato Hospital Board and the Waikato Area Health Board until its disestablishment in 1991. During that time he served as Chairperson of the Policy and Initiatives Committee. He was also Chairman of IANZ, (previously TELARC) the statutory body for accreditation in New Zealand, from 1987 until 1998.

In 1980 he was elected President of the New Zealand Society of Pathologists and for a number of years acted as an examiner in chemical pathology for the Royal Australasian College of Pathologists. He also served in a variety of executive roles for the New Zealand Medical Association including a term as Chairman from 1996 to 1998. In addition he was Chairman of the Confederation of Medical Associations in Asia and Oceania (CMAAO) from 1997 to 1999.

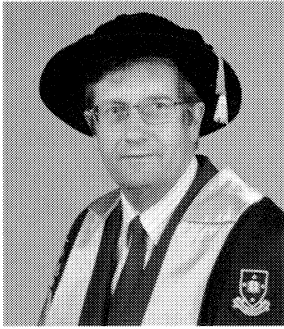
Brian served for 22 years in the New Zealand Territorial Forces, attaining the position of Assistant Director of Medical Services (ADMS) of New Zealand Land Forces, with the rank of Colonel.

He is a current member of the Institute of Directors and the NZMA Ethics Committee.

Brian was appointed to the Council of the University in 2002 and was elected as Pro Chancellor in 2006. He serves on the University's Finance, Risk Management and Human Research Ethics Committees and the Planning and Resources Committee.

Vice-Chancellor

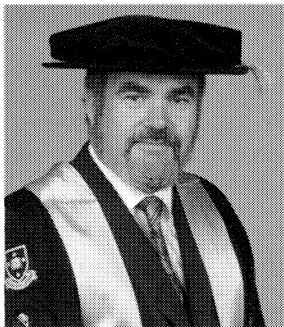
Professor Roy Crawford BSc(Hons) PhD DSc Belfast FIMechE FIMMM FEng



Professor Crawford was born in Lisburn, Northern Ireland and has spent most of his academic and professional life in Northern Ireland. He is a Professor of Mechanical Engineering, whose primary research interest has been in the mechanical properties and processing behaviour of plastics. From 1999 - 2001 he was Professor of Mechanical Engineering at the University of Auckland, and has on-going research and business interests in New Zealand associated with the establishment of a new polymer research centre. His previous position was the Senior Pro Vice-Chancellor at Queen's University, Belfast, with special responsibility for Research and Development. Professor Crawford has been a senior member of a small team that manages all aspects of Queen's University. He has published 7 books and over 270 papers and has been a member of numerous government panels and research grant committees in the UK. He is a member of a number of professional organisations and a Fellow of the Royal Academy of Engineering. He is directly involved in a wide range of professional activities and organisations, including consultancies and company directorships.

Deputy Vice-Chancellor

Professor Doug Sutton BA MA PhD Otago



Professor Sutton was born and raised in Southland, attending school there before proceeding to the University of Otago. Degrees there in Arts, Anthropology and Archaeology led to research in the Smithsonian Institute and a teaching post at the University of British Columbia, then appointment to the Anthropology Department of the University of Auckland. There he was promoted to a personal Chair, as co-founder of the Centre for Archaeological Research and instigator of a series of interdisciplinary research programmes, with support from the Marsden Fund, the Foundation of Research, Science and Technology and a range of other funding agencies. He served as Dean of Arts in the University of Auckland from 1997 until 2002. The Faculty was successful during that period in increasing research and creative work, in broadening and diversifying the range of agencies and philanthropists from whom it received support and in marshalling some considerable initiatives, including those which led to the formation of the School of Creative and Performing Arts, various new departments and a range of research centres and other intellectual foci.

Professor Sutton has gained international recognition for his work as an archaeologist. His research work has included archaeological fieldwork in the Subarctic, Patagonia, the Chatham Islands, Central and Northern New Zealand, as well as islands in the tropical Pacific. His New Zealand research has focussed on the archaeology of Pouerua, a magnificent Māori pa in the inland Bay of Islands, and on the controversial issues of when Aotearoa / New Zealand was first discovered. His new research is focussed on the authorship of biographies to better understand complex and formative moments in Colonial and Modern settings.

Pro Vice-Chancellor (Māori)

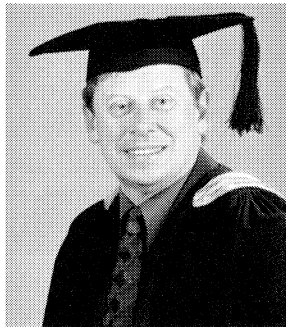
Professor Tamati Reedy BA MA Auckland MA PhD Hawai'i



Professor Reedy is the Pro Vice-Chancellor with responsibilities for Māori development in the University and Professor of Māori Sustainable Enterprise with the Waikato Management School. Professor Reedy was the foundation Dean and Professor of the School of Māori and Pacific Development at the University of Waikato, created in 1996. Professor Reedy gained his MA in English at Auckland University, and an MA and Doctorate in Linguistics at the University of Hawai'i. He was also a Fulbright Scholar at the University of Alabama. Prior to his appointment as Dean in 1996, Professor Reedy was the Chief Executive and Secretary for the Māori Affairs Department, New Zealand. He was awarded the 1990 New Zealand Medal. With his wife Tilly, he has managed his own consultancy business in education and training in the public and private sector until his appointment at Waikato University. He is Ngāti Porou.

Associate Professor Alan Neilson BSocSc MSocSc Waikato MSc York (UK)



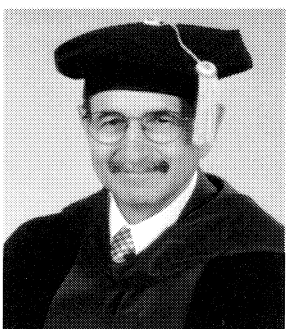
Associate Professor Neilson was educated at Tauranga Boys' College, the University of Waikato and the University of York (UK).

Dean of Arts and Social Sciences

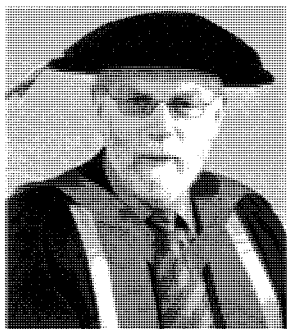
Professor Daniel Zirker BA MA Montana PhD Alberta



Professor Zirker was appointed to the position of Dean of Arts and Social Sciences in 2004. He previously served as the Dean of Arts and Sciences at Montana State University, Billings from 1998-2004, Professor of Political Science and various administrative positions at the University of Idaho from 1985-1998, and Assistant Professor of Political Science at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1983-1985. From 1999 to 2005 he held the position of the chair/president, and since 2005, Executive Director, of the Research Committee on Armed Forces and Society of the International Political Science Association. A former U.S. Peace Corps volunteer in Northeast Brazil from 1970-1972, he was a Fulbright senior lecturer at the University of Dar es Salaam, Tanzania in East Africa during the 1989-1990 academic year. He has published in academic books and journals on democratisation, economic development and civil-military relations in Brazil as well as in Africa and Eastern Europe.

Dean of Computing and Mathematical Sciences

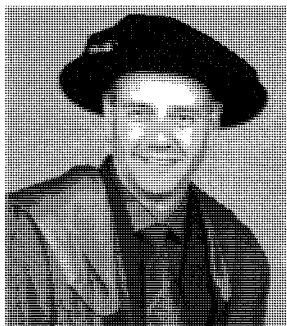
Professor Mark Apperley BE PhD Auckland FNZCS



Professor Apperley was appointed to the position of Dean of Computing and Mathematical Sciences in 2003. He began his academic career in electrical engineering but after completing his PhD at Auckland University, and a period of post-doctoral research at Imperial College in London, he returned to New Zealand in 1975 to take up a lectureship in Computer Science at the University of Waikato. In 1985 he became Professor and Head of the Computer Science Department at Massey University. He returned to Waikato University in 1994 as Chair of the Department. He has been very active in research in the areas of human-computer interaction and information visualisation throughout his academic career, and has published extensively on these topics. He is a Fellow of the New Zealand Computer Society.

Dean of Education

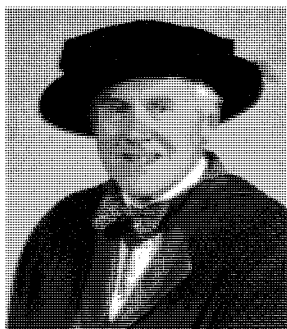
Professor Alister Jones BSc Otago MSc (Hons) PhD Waikato DipT MRSNZ



Professor Jones was appointed to the position of Dean of Education in 2007. He was previously Research Professor and Director of the Wilf Malcolm Institute of Education Research at the School of Education and has managed and directed research projects that have informed policy, curriculum and teacher development in New Zealand and internationally. His main area of interest is science and technology education and he has acted as an international consultant in curriculum and assessment. In 2000 he was awarded the New Zealand Science and Technology Medal for his significant contribution to the development of technology education nationally and internationally.

Professor John Farrar LLB (Hons) LLM LLD London PhD Bristol

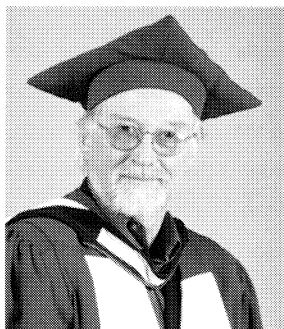


Professor Farrar was appointed to the position of Dean of Law in 2004. He was previously Dean of Law at the University of Canterbury and Dean of Law and Acting Vice-Chancellor at Bond University, Queensland. He is an Emeritus Professor of Law, Bond University, and a Professorial Fellow, University of Melbourne.

Professor Farrar is a member of the Legislation Advisory Committee and has been a consultant to the Business Council of Australia, Australian Institute of Company Directors, IFSA and New Zealand Treasury. He set up Community Legal Advice Centres in Bristol, Christchurch and the Gold Coast. He has experience in Company Law, Corporate Governance and Insolvency.

Professor Michael Pratt BA (Hons) *Sheffield MCom Witwatersrand DCom South Africa ACA FCA*



Professor Pratt was appointed to the position of Dean of Management in 1990. He is a specialist in the areas of performance, organization theory and auditing and was previously Professor and Head of the Department of Accounting at Massey University. With extensive industry experience Professor Pratt is currently involved in researching peak performing organisations. He has published eight books and more than one hundred journal and conference papers. He advises the CEOs and top management teams of several leading global corporations in the USA and Europe on inspiration, peak performance, and value creation.

Professor G. R. Aroha Yates-Smith BA MA PhD *Waikato DipT Hamilton Teachers' College*



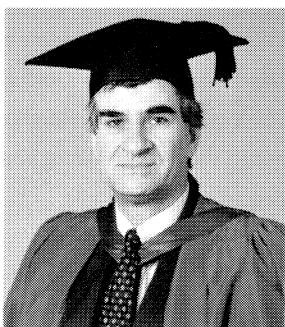

Professor Yates-Smith was appointed to the position of Dean of Te Pua Wānanga ki te Ao, the School of Māori and Pacific Development in 2004. She completed her BA, MA, and PhD at the University of Waikato, and her Diploma of Teaching at the Hamilton Teachers' College. Aroha entered this University as a Junior Lecturer in 1986, after having taught Māori and German at Hillcrest High School. She held a Fulbright Scholarship at the University of Hawai'i, at Manoa in 1992 and in 1999 became the first PhD graduate from Te Pua Wānanga ki te Ao. She was the recipient of Te Rangī Hiroa (Sir Peter Buck) medal in 2003 for her analysis of the role of women in pre-contact Māori society. Professor Yates-Smith's research interests lie in the study of the feminine in Māori society and Māori spirituality.

Dean of Science and Engineering

Professor Richard Price BSc (Hons) *Australian National University PhD Otago*



Professor Price was appointed to the position of Dean of Science and Engineering in 1998. Previously he spent 24 years on the academic staff of La Trobe University in Melbourne, Australia, Professor Price joined the University of Waikato as Dean of the School of Science and Engineering in 1998. He gained his bachelors degree in geology from Australian National University, and was awarded his doctorate from Otago University in 1974. His major research interests include the application of trace element, major element and isotope geochemistry to geological problems throughout Australia, New Zealand and the Pacific. With a distinguished academic and publishing record to his credit, Professor Price is currently involved in a co-operative research project studying the geology of Mounts Ruapehu and Taranaki with academic colleagues from Auckland, Victoria and Massey Universities, University College, Cork (Ireland) and Macquarie University (Australia).

The University Crest

The motto, Ko Te Tangata, means 'For the People' and reflects the University's philosophy that people are central to the institution and its most valued resource. The outside red border is a stylised fern frond or pitau that symbolises new birth, growth, vitality, strength and achievement. Inside the border is the University's coat of arms. The open book surrounded by the four stars of the Southern Cross is a symbol of learning. The crest design is in the University's colours of black, red and gold.

Ceremonial Traditions

Elements of university graduation ceremonies have evolved from the 12th century when the first universities emerged in Europe. The organisation of medieval universities was modelled on the established institutions of the day – the church, the monastery, and the guild.

Latin was the language used by medieval scholars, and it is from Latin that the words 'university' and 'degree' are derived. The Latin term universitas means a guild or union and universities started as a scholastic guild – a self-constituted community of teachers and scholars.

The word graduate comes from the Latin word gradus, which means step. Admission to study a bachelors degree was the first step taken towards completing a university education. The second step was to become a 'master'. Masters were Master of Arts graduates whose degrees licensed them to teach. The Chancellor, an officer of the cathedral, originally granted teaching licences.

Ceremonial Robes



The academic gowns and hoods worn by graduates and University staff today are fashioned on everyday medieval garments.

In the Middle Ages the corporate existence of universities was recognised and sanctioned by civil or ecclesiastical authority. The regalia worn by graduates and university staff today reflect this mix of medieval governance. Robes worn by the Chancellor resemble those worn by the Lord Chancellor of England. Graduates and academic staff wear gowns similar to the dress of medieval clergy. Hoods are also fashioned on an everyday medieval garment, although the coloured lining was a later addition to indicate the wearer's university and degree.

University of Waikato Academic Dress

Academic regalia are as follows:

First Bachelors: Black gown; black hood with gold lining; black mortarboard.

Bachelors with Honours: Black gown; black hood with gold lining and gold border 5cm in width; black mortarboard.

Masters: Black gown; gold hood with gold lining; black mortarboard.

MPhil: Black gown; crimson hood with crimson lining; black mortarboard.

PhD: Maroon gown; crimson hood with crimson lining; black Tudor bonnet.

DLit, DSc: Crimson gown; crimson hood with crimson lining; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

HonD: Crimson gown; gold hood with gold lining; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor: Black gown with lining of gold satin; gold button and cord just above the sleeves which are also lined with gold satin; a replica of the University's coat of arms just above the gold button on the shoulder; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

Pro Chancellor: Black gown with lining of gold satin; gold button and cord just above the sleeves which are lined with black satin; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

Keynote Speaker Biographies

Hon Margaret Wilson

The Hon Margaret Wilson was born in Gisborne. She was educated at St Joseph's School and later at St Dominic's College, Northcote and Morrinsville College. Margaret studied law at Auckland University, completing an LLB (Hons) and MJur (1st Class). After graduation she worked as a law clerk and barrister and solicitor before teaching at Auckland University. She was appointed as foundation Dean and Professor of Law at the University of Waikato in 1990, and continues to maintain strong links with the Law School as an Honorary Professor. Margaret first entered Parliament on the Labour Party list in 1999 and gained a Ministerial post immediately after her election. Her Ministerial positions included Attorney-General, Minister of Labour, Minister Responsible for Treaty of Waitangi Negotiations, Minister of Commerce, Minister for Courts and Associate Minister of Justice. Other positions held include President of the New Zealand Labour Party 1984-1987; Chief Political Adviser and Head of the Prime Minister's Office 1987-1989; Law Commissioner 1987-1989; Director, Reserve Bank 1985-1989; Chair, National Advisory Council on the Employment of Women 1987-1991. In 2004, Margaret was awarded an HonD by the University of Waikato in recognition of her distinguished academic career, her exceptional contribution to public life through her political career, and her outstanding service to the community. Elected Speaker in March 2005, Margaret is the first woman Speaker of New Zealand's House of Representatives. She was re-elected as speaker in November 2005.

June McCabe

June McCabe is a Director of Cranleigh Merchant Bankers. Her key interests are governance, strategic planning, executive mentoring, venture capital and sustainable development, corporate responsibility and Māori economic development. She champions Māori economic development and the empowerment of women entrepreneurs as fundamental to New Zealand's economic sustainability. After an extensive career in the public sector, June moved into merchant banking in 1992 as an operator in Fay Richwhite Limited with prime responsibility for Mortgage Corporation, a mortgage securitization vehicle. In 1997 she joined Westpac Banking Corporation New Zealand, gaining corporate banking experience. Here, June held a number of senior roles including Chief Manager Government Business, Head of Corporate Strategy and Director Corporate Affairs reporting to the Chief Executive. During her tenure with Westpac she co-authored a book to assist women in career and business: *Women2Women*, which was a best seller in 2003. She has governance experience of over 10 years, having been on a number of public, private and not-for-profits organisations, including Housing New Zealand, Accident Compensation Corporation and Westpac's Superannuation Scheme. June currently sits on the boards of The New Zealand Venture Investment Fund, Television New Zealand, E Centre Limited and is Chairman of Excelsior - The New Zealand Leadership Institute and Trustee of Turn Your Life Around (TYLA). Over the years, June has also held a number of advisory positions and is currently on the Hui Taumata Taskforce and the Auckland Mayors taskforce for Sustainable Auckland. June McCabe's tribal affiliations are: Ngapuhi, Te Rarawa, Te Aupouri, Ngati Kahu and Ngati Kahurau

Dr Paul Hutchison

In the 1999 General Election, Dr Paul Hutchison was elected as Member of Parliament for Port Waikato. He is the National Party spokesperson for Tertiary Education; Disability Issues; Research, Science & Technology/CRIs; and Policy on Children. Paul has more than 30 years' experience as a health professional. He has worked as a specialist consultant both in public and private practice and was a founding director of one of New Zealand's first private day stay facilities. Paul studied at Victoria and Otago Universities and completed an MB.ChB in 1970. From 1972-1974 Paul worked as a Resident in Pathology at Metropolitan General Hospital, Cleveland, USA. He then returned to New Zealand to work as Senior House Officer and Registrar at National Women's Hospital in Auckland. Paul became a lecturer for the University of London at St Thomas' Hospital and qualified as a specialist in Obstetrics and Gynaecology. On return to New Zealand, he became a consultant at National Women's Hospital, at North Shore Hospital, working part-time in private practice.

Jamie Fitzgerald

Jamie Fitzgerald is one of Waikato University's most adventurous graduates. In 2004, he finished his BCS degree majoring in Management Communication and Marketing, whilst managing his own business and captaining the university men's rowing team in The Great Race, against rivals Cambridge and Oxford universities from England. During Jamie's degree, he competed in the Trans-Atlantic Rowing Race, a 5000km journey in a tiny rowing boat with fellow adventurer Kevin Biggar. They broke the world record, and Jamie returned home to complete a large-scale speaking tour in conjunction with the University, during which he promoted sport and education to New Zealand secondary school students. After graduating, Jamie used his business experience in the banking environment, where he took up various management positions within ANZ Bank. In mid-2005 he committed to another extreme endurance event with Biggar, and they became the first Kiwis to walk to the South Pole unaided. During the summer of 2006-7, Jamie and Kevin spent 52 days dragging 160 kilogram sleds in temperatures below minus thirty, and in reaching the South Pole helped celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the founding of Scott Base by their expedition patron, Sir Edmund Hillary. Jamie has returned from Antarctica and is again promoting his experiences to secondary schools with Waikato University, delivering motivational and leadership-based presentations to corporate companies, and brainstorming ideas for his next adventure.

Rt Hon Jim Bolger

The Rt Hon Jim Bolger was Prime Minister of New Zealand from October 1990 to December 1997. During his 25-year career in politics he led the National Party for almost 12 years, was a Minister for 16 years and had three consecutive terms as the country's head of government. Under his leadership, the New Zealand economy was transformed from having the lowest growth rate among the 29 OECD nations to one of the strongest. On 31 December 1997 Mr Bolger was appointed a member of the Order of New Zealand (ONZ), New Zealand's highest honour. From June 1998 to January 2002 Mr Bolger was New Zealand's Ambassador to the United States. Today Mr Bolger is the chair of New Zealand Post and its subsidiary Kiwibank. He also chairs the Advisory Board of the World Agricultural Forum, St Louis, USA, is chairman of the Board of Directors of the Ian Axford Fellowships in Public Policy, Chairman of the Gas Industry Company Limited, Chairman of Express Couriers Limited, Chairman of Trustees Executors Limited, Trustee of the Rutherford Trust, President of the NZ/US Council. In January 2004 he was made Patron of the Institute of Rural Health. In February 2007 he was co-opted to the University of Waikato Council and elected Chancellor.

Deborah Hill Cone

Deborah Hill Cone is an award-winning journalist and media commentator. Deborah was educated in Hamilton at Melville High School and Waikato University, where she studied for a Bachelor of Arts degree, majoring in Philosophy. She also began her journalism career in Hamilton working at the local radio station, and this led to an 11 year stint at the National Business Review, two of them as news editor. Deborah's investigative reporting and feature writing were recognised with five Qantas Media Awards. In 1997 Deborah was a Reuter Foundation Fellow at Green College, Oxford and in 2005 she won the Australasian Citigroup Excellence in Journalism award, a scholarship to attend the Columbia University Post-Graduate School of Journalism in New York City. Deborah has a particular interest in education and is a trustee of the City of Manukau Education Trust.

Rt Hon Sir Geoffrey Palmer

The Rt Hon Sir Geoffrey Palmer is the President of the New Zealand Law Commission. He is also the New Zealand Commissioner on the International Whaling Commission, Chair of the Legislation Advisory Committee of the New Zealand Government, and an Honorary Lecturer at Victoria University of Wellington. Sir Geoffrey was the Member of Parliament for Christchurch Central from 1979 until 1990. He became Deputy Leader of the Opposition in 1983. With the election of the Fourth Labour Government in 1984 he became Deputy Prime Minister, Leader of the House of Representatives, Attorney-General and Minister of Justice. After the re-election of the Labour Government in 1987 he dropped the role as Leader of the House and took up the portfolio of Minister for the Environment. On succeeding David Lange as Prime Minister, he dropped the legal portfolios but kept the environmental portfolio. Geoffrey Palmer has been responsible for much constitutional legislation and law reform. These measures include the Constitution Act 1986 and the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 1990. He was also centrally involved in the legislative changes that changed the nature of the state sector in New Zealand. In particular he was involved in the preparation and passing of the State Owned Enterprises Act 1986, the State Sector Act 1988 and the Public Finance Act 1989. As Minister for the Environment he was responsible for the introduction of the Resource Management Bill which led ultimately to the Resource Management Act in 1991. Geoffrey Palmer holds a BA in Political Science and an LLB from Victoria University of Wellington and a Doctor of Law degree, cum laude from the University of Chicago. He has been awarded honorary doctorates by Hofstra University in New York and Washington University in St. Louis. Geoffrey Palmer is a laureate of the United Nations Environment Programme's "Global 500 Roll of Honour". He is a Fellow of the World Academy of Arts and Sciences. He has been a visiting committee member of the University of Chicago Law School. He was Foundation President of the New Zealand branch of the International Law Association.

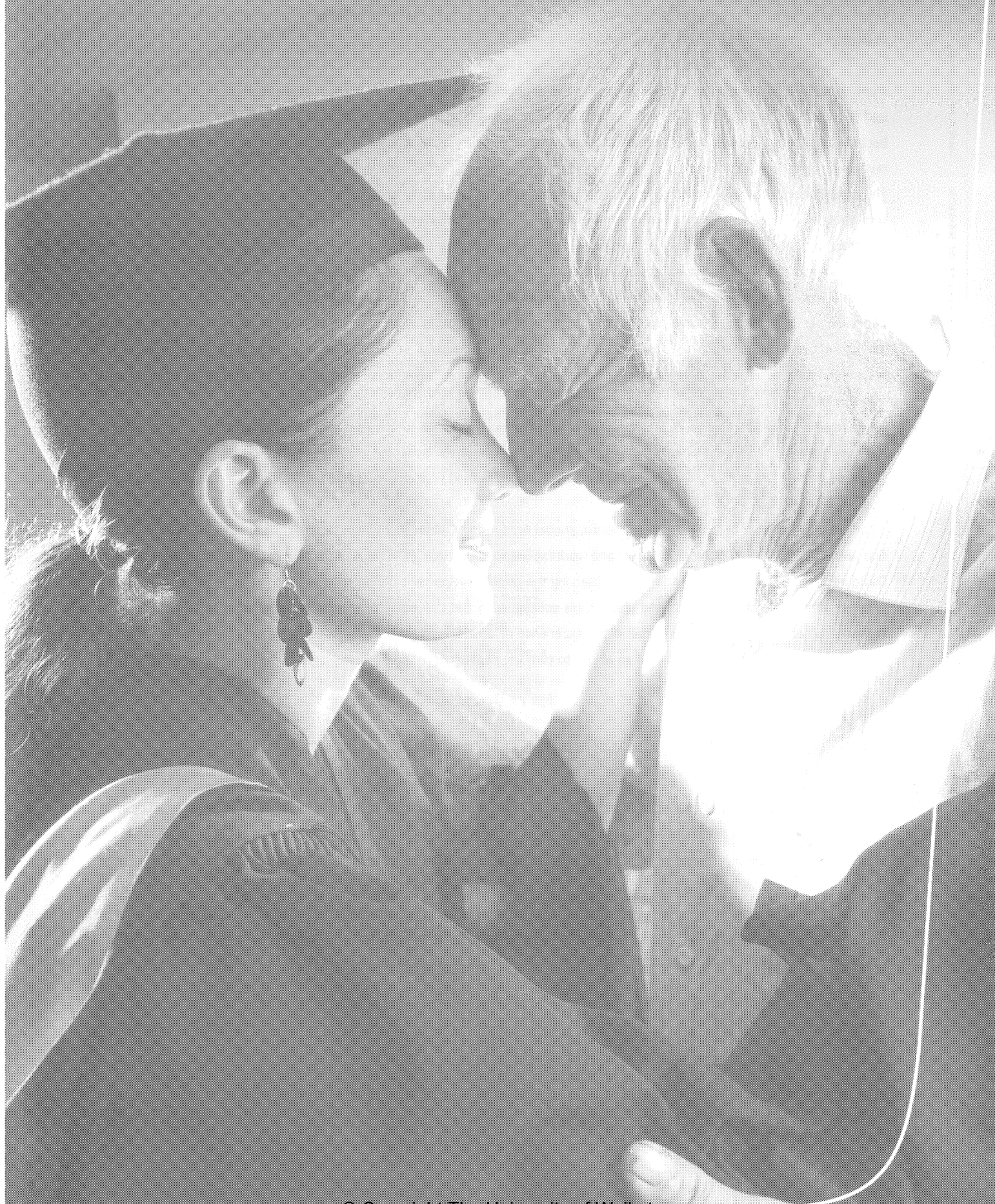

David Victor Coy In thirteen years as a member of the Department of Accounting, David Coy left an indelible impression on his colleagues in the Department and the Waikato Management School, and on many others with whom he came into contact. He was joint Chairperson of the Department for some four years and in that role, was acknowledged as providing exemplary service in transforming a Department that had undergone many difficulties into one that was noted for its effective and efficient management and above all, for its collegiality. For eight years, David managed the 499 programme for which the Waikato Management School has become noted; this requires undergraduate students in their fourth year of study to undertake the report of an investigation for an outside organisation or company.

The contribution for which David might best be remembered, both nationally and internationally, arose following his PhD thesis. As something of a "crusader" for transparency in accounting, David almost single-handedly introduced a new methodology for external reporting by tertiary institutions. His development of measurable Key Performance Indicators changed their manner of reporting forever. Thanks to his innovative efforts, universities and polytechnics throughout the country had available to them, for the first time, data that was much more meaningful than had had ever previously been the case. Transparency of performance and accountability of personnel and institutions, resulted from his passion to improve the quality of external reporting. His initiatives were enthusiastically adopted in other industries, notably the electricity industry where, similarly, a broader reporting methodology containing much more meaningful data, became available. David published regularly in leading international journals and received citations for the excellence of his work.

David was an innovator, as well, in projects such as the introduction of his fourth year spreadsheet paper and of a reading recovery module in the second year Management Accounting paper. The latter arose out of his deep interest in, and commitment to, his students. Noting the difficulty that some students experienced in their written expression, he introduced a programme to assist them in this area.

David established what became a very successful annual Accounting Careers Fair where recent graduates would return to share with first year students their wide range of career and work experiences, illustrating the value of the accounting major in their career choices. David obtained a great deal of pleasure from observing the career development of his graduates and the confidence they had acquired. Whether among his students, past and present, his colleagues in the University or the international community of scholars, David remained accessible, genuinely interested in the experience of others, a warm and esteemed colleague. An innovator in his field, he enjoyed wide respect, and demonstrated an ability to turn the negative into the positive.
